## Day 1: Sightseeing of Ston and Pelješac peninsula

**Ston** is the main town of the county which is located on the Peljesac peninsula. The town of Ston has the second largest wall surrounding it – this defence wall dates back to 14th Century, it is 5.5 km long and it is also the longest remaining fortification system in the world after the Chinese Wall. Ston also has the oldest salt pans in the Europe located on the sea. Ston is famous for it's oysters, coming from it's own breeding site.

**Pelješac peninsula** is second largest peninsula in Croatia, located northwest of Dubrovnik, famous for its vineyards, quality wine, real tasty sea-shells, salt pans and the medieval town of Ston.



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## Day 2: Sightseeing of Cavtat and Konavle

- Walking tour to the town of Cavtat and Bukovac gallery
- Free time for individual visits and shopping
- Drive through the authentic villages of Konavle
- Visit of local household wine cellar and wine tasting
- Lunch at the rural household in Konavle

The central settlement south from Dubrovnik is the picturesque town of **Cavtat**, the ancient Epidaurum of the Adriatic; Civitas Vetus, the predecessor of Dubrovnik. A Medieval town built according to zoning plans on the slopes of peninsula with two easily accessible bays. For centuries, it's construction was based on the Dubrovnik principles of harmony.

One of most interesting places to visit is the birthplace of Vlaho Bukovac, one of the most famous Croatian painters and founders of the modern Croatian painting. The house preserves about 200 paintings, drawings, sketches and items from his life. Tour includes wine tasting in domestic wine cellar and lunch at rural household in **Konavle** region too.
